Welcome Leo XIV

On the fourth ballot on the second day of the conclave, Cardinal Robert Prevost, the sixty-nine-year-old native of Chicago and former prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops, was elected pope, taking the name Leo XIV.

Robert Francis Prevost was born on 14
September 1955, in Chicago, Illinois, to
Louis Marius Prevost, of French and
Italian descent, and Mildred Martínez, of
Spanish descent. He has two brothers,
Louis Martín and John Joseph. He joined
the Augustinians and after ordination in



1982, and further studies, joined the Order's mission to Peru in 1985. He was credited with expanding the role of local-born clergy in the mission and held several roles in teaching and formation for the mission in the north-western city of Trujillo. He also served as a parish priest and founded a new parish, dedicated to St Rita, in a poor district of the city.

Prevost alternated between work with the mission and with the Augustinian province in Chicago - becoming in 1999 the provincial superior - until he was made the Order's prior general in 2001, holding the post until 2013. A year after that, Pope Francis made him a titular bishop serving as the apostolic administrator of Chiclayo, on the north coast of Peru. In a statement, the charity Aid to the Church in Need said it had supported Prevost with projects while he was in Chiclayo, "including the formation of seminarians, missionaries and catechists, as well as with Mass stipends which in part supported missionaries working in remote parts of the Andes". Pope Francis made him the diocesan Bishop of Chiclay in 2015. He was succeeded in the diocese in 2024 by the native Peruvian Bishop Edinson Edgardo Farfán Córdova, a fellow Augustinian. Since succeeding Cardinal Marc Ouellet at the Dicastery of Bishops and becoming a cardinal shortly after, Prevost has led the search for candidates for the episcopate reflecting a more "pastoral" approach.

Pope Leo XIV brings decades of missionary, pastoral and curial experience to the papacy. He holds both US and Peruvian citizenship, making him both the first American and first Peruvian pope. He is known for his thoughtful discernment, multilingual fluency, speaking, English, Spanish, Italian, French, Portuguese and can read Latin and German—and ability to work across cultural and theological lines, traits that many believe will serve the Church well in this new chapter. In his opening addressing, Pope Leo advocated for unity, missionary zeal and humble service. He called on the Church to be a place of welcome and dialogue: 'We must seek together how to be a missionary Church, a Church that builds bridges, dialogue, always open to receive, like this square, with open arms.'

According to Fr Jack Wall of the Catholic Extension Society, "In choosing the name Leo XIV, our new pope aligns himself with a legacy of strength, clarity, and justice. Pope Leo XIII, one of the most influential voices of Catholic social teaching, boldly championed the dignity of work and the rights of labourers through his encyclical Rerum Novarum. It's a name that carries weight—and vision. And it offers a beautiful signal that this papacy may echo the same deep concern for the struggles and hopes of ordinary people."

REFLECTION ONE THIS SUNDAY'S GOSPEL

Shepherd and Sheep, Bonds of Love and Life
This fourth Sunday of Easter is traditionally known as Good
Shepherd Sunday because the Gospel for this Sunday always
portrays Jesus as the Good Shepherd. Being a shepherd in
the time of Jesus was not anything like the large-scale,
commercial farming enterprises of today. Then, a shepherd
usually had responsibility for about fifteen or twenty sheep
whom he accompanied day and night. Both shepherd and
sheep got to know each other. The shepherd was responsible
for keeping the flock together and safe, for leading it to good
pasture, for binding up wounds. The sheep depended on the
shepherd for life. No wonder the image of the Good
Shepherd became so popular as a description of the
relationship between Jesus and his followers.

Today's Gospel is full of warmth and intimacy in the way it speaks about Jesus' relationship with us.

The sheep who listen to Jesus belong to (are in relationship with) him. There is a sense of intimacy in the idea that Jesus knows each of the sheep who follow him. He knows them and they follow him because they are bound together by the bond of love. The sheep have life through their relationship with Jesus, a relationship which brings eternal life, not just after death; the sheep already live the eternal life of God here and now.

This relationship with Jesus and the eternal life it brings can never be lost or snatched away.

We are the gift that the Father gives to Jesus. And because the Father and Jesus live in deep communion with each other, we, too, are caught up in this enduring communion of love.

This love God has for us makes us part of God's family: God's beloved daughters and sons.

Any reflection about Jesus as the Good Shepherd also keeps us mindful that shepherding each other according to the heart of Jesus is part of our vocation as disciples.

CALL FOR SUPPORT ON PROPOSED COUNCIL RESPONSE TO HOMELESSNESS IN THE CITY OF PORT PHILLIP

You will see from the insert in this newsletter that a group of Non-Government Organisations (NGOs), including our parish and Sacred Heart Mission, among others, who respond to the needs of those in homelessness, in both service provision, advocacy and lobbying for a better, just and equitable response from governments, have been in talks with the City of Port Phillip over their motion to address homelessness in this municipality. The Council passed a motion directing Council officers to investigate and report back on options to fine and move-on individuals who finds themselves in homelessness. The work of the above organisations is underpinned by the principles of Catholic Social Teachings, specifically in this case, 'The life and dignity of the human person' and 'The preferential option for the poor and vulnerable'. Therefore, these organisations cannot support the Council's proposed response, which is punitive in nature. They are seeking support in turning Council's proposal around. At the end of the letter, they have listed suggestions for support. One of these is the direct lobbying of councillors, to this end, we have provided contact information. We encourage all to read the letter and take action as the Good Samaritan in Luke's Gospel (10:25-37).
