As we celebrate the feast day of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop this coming week (8 August), we remember her the gift of her legacy to those marginalised by poverty. We will honour St Mary at the Masses this weekend.

St Mary MacKillop, also known as Saint Mary of the Cross, was born in Melbourne in 1842 and died in Sydney in 1909. The process to have her declared a saint began in 1925 and she was eventually canonised in 2010, making her Australia's first saint. Her feast day is celebrated on 8 August.

'There where you are you will find God.'

Born into a large, financially challenged family of Scottish heritage, at aged 18, St Mary was offered a job working as governess to her aunt and uncle's children in Penola, South Australia. During this time, she began helping the poor. After two years she accepted a teaching job in Portland, Victoria and after another two years, opened her first boarding school. She and her sisters opened another school in Penola, teaching over 50 children.

'Tis true I only seek to serve God in the care of the little ones of His flock.'

In 1866, St Mary MacKillop took on the religious name 'Sister Mary of the Cross'. As other women joined her family, they started calling themselves Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart (The Josephites). The Josephites opened many schools dedicated to educating the poor and needy. By 1871 they had 130 sisters working in over 40 schools across South Australia and Queensland.

'God wants us by every means in our power to lead others to life.'

St Mary and the Josephites encountered many clashes with the clergy and were subject to interference in their constitution. St Mary refused to comply with the changes and was excommunicated for insubordination by Bishop Shiel. Most of the Josephites' schools were closed. On his deathbed, Bishop Shiel instructed that the excommunication be lifted, and St Mary was exonerated by an Episcopal Commission.

'Whenever your troubles may be before you, accept them cheerfully, remembering whom you are trying to follow. Do not be afraid. Love one another, bear with one another, and let charity guide you in all your life.'

Pope Leo XIII approved the Josephites, declaring them an official congregation in 1885. St Mary MacKillop was elected Superior General but there was ongoing friction over issues such as the Josephites' refusal to accept government funding or teach girls from wealthy families. St Mary was replaced but re-elected Mother Superior-General in 1899 and held the position until her death.

# **KEEPING OUR COMMUNITY SAFE**

In keeping with our commitment to keeping our community safe and proving a safe environment for all, particularly children, young people and vulnerable adults, we will celebrate our annual Safeguarding Weekend on 6 / 7 September. During August we will focus on and promote a number of safeguarding initiatives. Please keep an eye out also on your email and on the website for a range of tasks we will ask you to support.

It is timely therefore that the Australian Catholic Standard Ltd

(ACSL) is undertaking a planned audit of The Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne over the next four months. This comprehensive audit assesses an organisation against the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards (NCSS). ACSL was created to promote and oversee a nationally consistent, comprehensive and sustainable framework for the protection of children and adults at risk within the Church in Australia. The findings of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse place responsibility on the Catholic Church to demonstrate greater respect, care and protection for everyone who places their trust in the Church and to comply with legislative obligations in safeguarding and professional standards.

The ACSL audit is a Strength-based Approach:

- Focuses on abilities, knowledge and capacities rather than deficits, or things that are lacking.
- Recognises that Church Authorities are resilient and are capable of growth, learning and change.
- Identifies strengths the Church Authority can build upon and use to support their ministries to manage risks.
- Doesn't avoid or minimise problems, challenges or risks.
- Doesn't attribute blame instead identifies changes to improve quality, safety and reduce the occurrence of abuse.
- Presents findings developmentally and as part of a continuous improvement program.
- Acknowledges that safeguarding is an ongoing journey.
   The ACSL audit:
- Is provided to the Archdiocese and is at the Archdiocese level, not parishes. Captures an accurate understanding of how safeguarding policies, practices and processes are developed and embedded across the congregation.
- Is strength-based approach that highlights the capabilities, knowledge, skills, connections and potential in individuals and ministries.
- The report addresses any areas of need that has emerged during the process.
- A draft Audit report is presented to the Leadership team for review and feedback. Recommendations for action and the timeframes are agreed by the leadership team.
- The Audit Report is finalised is published on the ACSL website.

Each parish across the Melbourne Archdiocese must undertake a Parish Self Assessment Tool. Our parish submitted the first version in 2022 and will submit the new version by the end of August. Twenty-five parishes across the Melbourne Archdiocese will be randomly selected to be part of the fieldwork section of the audit.
