A reflection on Today's Gospel

[An extract from Fr Mikes in an article entitled: Pushing Back the Darkness, www.interruptingthesilence.com]

"What do you see when you look into the lamp of your life? Is it full of oil, running out, or empty? Is the oil fresh or has it become rancid? Is your lamp burning brightly or is it growing dim? Light or darkness, full or empty lamps, fresh or rancid oil are not about what is happening around us, the circumstances of our life and world, but about what is happening within us. They are metaphors for our spiritual condition, our inner way of being.

It would be so easy to divide and categorise the ten bridesmaids into two groups - the wise and foolish, the prepared and unprepared, the good and bad, the winners and losers, the welcomed and rejected. More often than not that's what we do to ourselves and each other. To divide and categorise the ten bridesmaids, however, is to forget, ignore, or misunderstand what today's gospel says. All ten bridesmaids were a part of the kingdom. All ten were invited to the wedding banquet. All ten went to meet the bridegroom. All ten become drowsy and fell asleep. All ten had lamps. All ten were meant, intended, and called to be carriers of the light...

Every day we either add to the light of the world or we add to its darkness... When I break relationships; turn away from the needs, concerns, or hopes of another; or act as if I have no need of him or her; my world becomes darker. And when I remain open and receptive, soften my heart, and recommit to love my neighbour as myself, a new light begins to shine...

None of us are all light or all darkness. We're all a mixture of both. Some days I add light to the world and other days I add darkness.

I don't think the question is whether there is darkness today in our life and world. There is. The question is this: What are you doing about it? What am I doing about it? Every time I live in that dark place, every time I add darkness to the world... I am no longer the light carrier I want to be or that God created me to be. No wonder Jesus says to the five bridesmaids, "I do not know you." He's speaking to the darkened part in each of our lives. It's not so much a rejection as it is a call to discover the light within us, a call to let our light shine.

What does that mean and look like for you today? How's your oil level? And if you're a quart low what are you doing about that? What's going on in the lamp of your life? The world needs your light. There is not a person or a place in our world today that is not in need of light. Your light makes a difference. You can push back the darkness with your light of love, hope, healing, forgiveness, gentleness, compassion. The light of Christ is already within you. "You are the light of the world." Let's leave this place today, face our darkness, and shine our light. For it is God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness" (2 Corinthians 4:6)."

FROM THE CITY OF PORT PHILLIP

Council is investigating opportunities to improve safety on Inkerman Street, between St Kilda Road and Hotham Street. Inkerman Street has a high number of crashes compared to other Council-managed roads, with 33 recorded crashes between St Kilda Road and Hotham Street in the 5-year period ending June 2022 with 14 of the 33 crashes resulted in a serious injury. The road surface of Inkerman Street between St Kilda Road and Westbury Street is in average to poor condition and is scheduled for re-sheeting, which provides an opportunity to address existing safety concerns in this area while conducting maintenance. Concept designs have been developed to improve safety on Inkerman Street. A number of pop-up consultation will occur along Inkerman Street in the coming weeks beginning next Tuesday, 14 November from 12 pm - 2 pm at Henryville St & Inkerman Street. At the pop-up, free coffee and cake will be provided to residents that complete the survey.

CARITAS AUSTRALIA GAZA APPEAL

Despite the uncertainties surrounding humanitarian access, Caritas Australia can confirm that over 9,000 households have been supported with cash assistance, essential supplies, and psychological first aid via partner agencies on the ground. Four churches have been established as temporary shelter locations for 1,200 displaced people. Partners are also focusing on winterisation with blankets, mattresses, and mats for about 1,100 households, as well as working to explore temporary shelter options. However, supplies are running out. Sally Thomas, Humanitarian Emergencies Lead at Caritas Australia states that, "Day by day it is hard to imagine the situation becoming more unbearable, but that is what is happening and those in Gaza have no avenues of escape. The human suffering must end, and it must end now - with human rights and dignity restored on all sides. A pause in fighting at this point is not enough ..."
